Note on eligibility for becoming a Councillor

Only persons who are eligible may become a Councillor. The full rules on eligibility are available from the Clerk, but include the requirements that a Councillor must be at least 18 years old and be a Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of a member state of the European Union. A Councillor must also (1) be and will continue to be registered as a local government elector for the Parish, (2) have lived in, or within three miles of, the Parish for the whole of the 12 months up to the date of becoming a Councillor, (3) had his/her principal place of work in the Parish for the whole of the 12 months prior to the date of becoming a Councillor, or (4) have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the Parish during the whole of the twelve months up to the date of becoming a Councillor. A person is disqualified from becoming a Councillor if he/she has been disqualified under the Representation of the People Act 1983 for corrupt or illegal electoral practices, has been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more during the last five years or is subject to a bankruptcy restrictions order.
